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As the days get shorter, the change in seasons can be a hard time of year. Even as the pandemic drags on, there are signs life is beginning to return to normal for many of us and we're able to do things that seemed impossible only months ago.

But for women experiencing intimate partner violence, the light at the end of the tunnel still seems a long way off ... if they can see it at all. After almost two years of being told to "go home and stay home," women facing abuse are feeling as trapped as ever. Living under the constant threat of violence, the mental health costs are staggering – and increasing. Anxiety and depression are at an all-time high for so many.

As the global pandemic continues, we are proud to share that Interval House is still 100% COVID-19 free. We have received a great response from residents who have stayed in our sanctuary suites. Each room is equipped with all of the client's everyday needs including an ensuite bathroom, a minifridge, microwave, flat screen tv, coffee maker, laptop, and so much more to ensure their comfort and safety.

For the overall health and safety of our residents, volunteers and staff, we now have a rapid COVID-19 rapid testing stations at the shelter. Thanks to our supporters and partners, we are continuing our increased sanitization procedures and providing high quality PPE to all staff and residents.

This is only possible because you gave us the ability to quickly adjust our procedures, move most of our in-person programming online, and more recently – as you'll read about in **our most recent newsletter** - create our sanctuary suties for residents who may need a safe place to quarantine.

For our staff and clients, the fall months are a very busy time. We often see a rise in the number of women fleeing abusive partners with their children but the ongoing global pandemic has made our services more important than ever. Our counsellors in the shelter, and with our BESS program, are ready to welcome survivors in need of refuge and support, even during an ongoing global pandemic. It is because of your continued support that we can continue to create a safe space for women and children to heal, grow and support each other. They are rebuilding their self-worth and self-confidence. They are breaking the cycle of abuse.

We are very grateful to all the support and generousity. Thank you, to all of our donors, for taking a stand to end intimate partner violence and helping survivors rebuild their lives.




