Virtual Counselling Services



Our **Virtual Counselling Services (VCS)** program is designed to meet each woman's unique needs and challenges. Outside of individualized counselling, clients have access to our secure online portal which houses a variety of learning modules and e-Books focused on education, awareness, and early steps to prevent violence.

One of the newest additions to our resource library is an e-Book titled **Building and Maintaining Friendships**, aimed at supporting survivors as they rebuild trust, reconnect with old friends, and seek to create new healthy friendships.

Clients have said they are finding the e-Books really helpful in understanding their relationships and figuring out how to move forward in a safe and positive way.

Financial Literacy Pilot Project



The Financial Literacy Pilot Project (FLPP) scales up on our existing BESS program, empowering participants to strengthen their financial management skills.

Clients take part in monthly workshops, receive one-on-one coaching, and develop a personalized financial work plan with the help of our Financial Empowerment Specialist.

This month's workshop, **How to Find Ways to Boost Your Income**, walked clients through using online tools to find practical ways to increase their income.

We're excited to see clients deepen their financial knowledge and feel empowered to take control of their finances.
